Watching Them Grow! webinar. Voices from the Field events feature leaders sharing about their work to significantly improve the lives of women, children and youth around the world. The webinars provide an opportunity to meet with our regional missionaries virtually, listen to their stories about projects supported by our mission dollars, and ask them any questions you have. If you haven't participated in one of these webinars, I encourage you to do so. You can also watch the recordings of past Voices From the Field webinars on the United Women in Faith Digital website. They are all very interesting; check them out when you get a chance.

The <u>response</u> magazine also has many good articles about our mission dollars at work. In the January/February 2025 issue there is a story about Pasumai Ulagam, a project which provides instruction in the art of tailoring and provides microloans to women living in rural India. For a loan of \$100, a woman can buy a sewing machine or the products needed to start her own business. Think about it – by giving a gift of \$100 to missions through United Women in Faith, a woman in India can become self-supporting! The great thing about these microloans is that the repayment rate is very high, and the money that is paid back can be loaned out to someone else. Think about how many lives we can change for the better by a small increase in our mission giving! Small increases in giving can provide huge returns for women, children and youth around the world! Let's all try to increase our mission giving by ten percent this year. We can do this!

Conference Social Action Coordinator (SAC), I am on the steering committee for this annual event. This year Advocacy Day takes place on Wednesday, March 12. If you've participated before, just head to the website, https://michiganumc.org/advocacy-day-2025/ and register if you can attend.

If you can't attend, you can still participate! We need every United Methodist to contact their representatives in the Michigan legislature to advocate for this year's focus: Fixing the 2019 no-fault car insurance changes. The problem? The change drastically reduced reimbursement rates for care providers. The result? Care for survivors is often unavailable. Families worry that an injured love one could die as a result.

We need to advocate for the following two changes in the law: (1) **provide** sustainable reimbursement rates for medical providers and (2) increase the number of hours that family caregivers can be reimbursed.

Think it won't happen to you? Seven Michiganders are severely injured every day. We need to fix this! Put your Faith in Action; you can make an impact!

CHARTER FOR RACIAL JUSTICE 101

Since 1844 issues of racial justice have impacted the Methodist denomination. Because of disagreements over slavery and authority of bishops, there was a denominational split. Post Civil War, the U.S ended slavery but moved to

persevered establishing schools, serving missionaries and advocating for equity. In 1940, Thelma Stevens became the Woman's Division head of Christian Social Relations in the newly formed Methodist church. She was instrumental in the writing of the first Charter of Racial Policies in 1952. A year earlier a book entitled, "States Laws on Race and Color" was published. That book commissioned by the Woman's Division became a source for the U.S. Supreme Court in its deliberations on Brown v. Board of Education. In 1962, a new Charter for Racial Policies was adopted by the General Conference upon petition of the Woman's Division. In 1968 General Conference brought together the Methodist Church and the United Brethren Church, creating the United Methodist Church. Two years later, the third Charter for Racial Justice was adopted. Then in 1980, the Charter for Racial Justice Policies was adopted by General Conference. In 2016, United Methodist Women became an independent organization within the United Methodist Church.

MARCH 23 - DAY OF GIVING

Why March 23? On this date in 1869, a group of eight intrepid women founded the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society, the forerunner of United Women in Faith. Their vision was to create educational opportunities and provide health care to women in India. These founding women invited others to join their mission through their prayers and two pennies. Thus, a movement of faith and generosity in action was born.

Practicing Hope by Tabatha Holley


CHILDRENS STUDY: Hope is a Resurrection People

Practicing Hope is an adult curriculum exploring hope, particularly when hope seems hard to find. The curriculum asks questions such as: What is hope in the face of neofascism? What is hope in a time of genocide? How do we imagine a future for the next generation as our planet grows hotter by the season? What tools do we have to face these hard realities? How does Christ teach us to embody hope when our backs are against the wall? This study's purpose is to cultivate hope that is honest about our current conditions (refugia), hope that is restorative when everything feels urgent (rest), and hope that is possible even when we transgress (repair).

YOUTH STUDY: Communities of the Spirit:
Living into Hope as Resurrection People by Regina
Heaater is a youth curriculum that examines the
hope we find in early post-resurrection Christian
communities and how they kept hope alive
even in seemingly hopeless times. Explore how
we can create such communities today by
examining common themes found in the postresurrection stories: bravery, miracles, rituals, time and
diversity, the fruit of the Spirit, and adversity and

diversity, the fruit of the Spirit, and adversity and perseverance. Participants will consider these themes with a sense of wonder and create a Community of the Spirit of their own. They will be asked to consider what they believe are important components of a Community of the Spirit, with the hope that they will

by Joni Cisowski is a children's curriculum that helps children build trust in Jesus to bring them comfort and support as they find courageous hope in the face of uncertainty. As they move through each session, they will develop their understanding of hope by reflecting on important people, communities, places, activities, personal goals, and desires for the future. Then, they will look for ways to build communal hope to be the change our world needs today. Children will create a "Tree of Hope," offering them a time of creative reflection as they explore parts of their lives that help build hope—from the people (roots).
