CHARTER FOR RACIAL JUSTICE 101

Charter for Racial Justice in an Interdependent Global Community Because we believe:

- 1. That God is the Creator of all people, and all are God's children in one family;
- 2. That racism is a rejection of the teachings of Jesus Christ;
- 3. That racism denies the redemption and reconciliation of Jesus Christ;
- 4. That racism robs all human beings of their wholeness and is used as a justification for social, economic, environmental, and political exploitation;
- 5. That we must declare before God and before one another that we have

- sinned against our sister and brothers of other races in thought, in word, and in deed:
- 6. That in our common humanity in creation, all women and men are made in God's image, and all persons are equally valuable in the sight of God;
- 7. That our strength lies in our racial and cultural diversity and that we must work toward a world in which each person's value is respected and nurtured;
- 8. That our struggle for justice must be based on new attitudes, new understandings, and new relationships, and must be reflected in the laws, policies, structures, and practices of both church and state;

We commit ourselves as individuals and as a community to follow Jesus Christ in word and in deed, and to struggle for the rights and the self-determination of every person and group of persons.

Book Talk during Mission u

Summertime and the reading is ready! Come to think of it, reading is a good activity during fall, winter, and spring, too!

I'd like to bring two books to your attention that I will use for the Book Talk during Mission u at Mt. Pleasant First UMC July 17-19. There will be more details about the event in this edition of the VOICE, so I am just going to

highlight the Reading Program part. It will be offered as a Break Out Session on Friday, July 18 at 3:00.

The first book is My Body Is Not a Prayer Request: Disability Justice in the Church by Amy Kenny.

Much of the church has forgotten that we worship a disabled God whose wounds survived resurrection, says Amy Kenny. It is time for the church to start treating disabled people as full members of the body of Christ who have much more to offer than a miraculous cure narrative and to learn from their embodied experiences.

Written by a disabled Christian, this book shows that the church is missing out on the prophetic witness and blessing of disability. Kenny reflects on her experiences inside the church to expose unintentional ableism and cast a new vision for Christian communities to engage disability justice. She shows that until we cultivate church spaces where people with disabilities can fully belong, flourish, and lead, we are not valuing the diverse members of the body of Christ.

Offering a unique blend of personal storytelling, fresh and compelling writing, biblical exegesis, and practical application, this book invites readers to participate in disability justice and create a more inclusive community in church and parachurch spaces. .

You will gain a new perspective on people with disabilities who are a part of the church, or at least want to be! It is a 2025 Reading Program selection under Leadership Development.

The second featured book will be <u>Starfish</u> by Lisa Fipps. It is a youth book under Nurturing for Community, 2025. The back cover briefly describes it as: *A Printz honor - winning novel-in-verse about a girl who is tired of being fat-shamed and is ready to do something about it.*

Please come join us! Bring your own copy or a library copy if available. Reading the books will be helpful but not necessary! If you read both books, plus the study book Practicing Hope by Tabatha Holley, you will be over halfway to completing Plan I of the Reading Program!

Practicing Hope by Tabatha Holley

Practicing Hope is an adult curriculum exploring hope, particularly when hope seems hard to find. The curriculum asks questions such as: What is hope in the face of neofascism? What is hope in a time of genocide? How do we imagine a future for the next generation as our planet grows hotter by the season? What tools do we have to face these hard realities? How does Christ teach us to embody hope when our backs are against the wall? This study's purpose is to cultivate hope that is honest about our current conditions (refugia), hope that is restorative when everything feels urgent (rest), and hope that is possible even when we transgress (repair).

YOUTH STUDY: Communities of the Spirit Living into Hope as Resurrection People by Regina Heater is a youth curriculum that examines the hope we find in early post-resurrection Christian communities and how they kept hope alive even in seesmingly hopeless times. Explore how we can create such communities today by examining common themes found in the post-resurrection stories: bravery, miracles, rituals, time and diversity, the fruit of the Spirit, and adversity and perseverance. Participants will consider these themes with a sense of wonder and create a Community of the Spirit of their own. They will be asked to consider what they believe

are important components of a Community of the Spirit, with the hope that they will identify for themselves what they need in a community to help them continue to become the people God is calling them to be.

children build trust in Jesus to bring them comfort and support as they find courageous hope in the face of uncertainty. As they move through each session, they will develop their understanding of hope by reflecting on important people, communities, places, activities, personal goals, and desires for the future. Then, they will look for ways to build communal hope to be the change our world needs today. Children will create a "Tree of Hope," offering them a time of creative reflection as they explore parts of their lives that help build hope—from the people (roots), ground (places and communities), to the fruit (joy meant to be shared), and finally, a forest as we

come together as a forest of hope-

preparing our hearts to serve.



She is a graduate of Perkins School of Theology with a M.Div. and Women's Studies Certification and Texas A&M Commerce with a B.S. in Biology. Sally is a long-time member of First UMC Grand Prairie (TX). She regularly attends Teaneck UMC in Teaneck, NJ and is a member of their United Women in Faith unit. She is an active member of the Bergen County Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.
